## 1 Peter - Week 11 Relationships

1 Peter 2:18 Slaves, submit yourselves to your masters with all respect, not only to those who are good and considerate, but also to those who are harsh. 19 For it is commendable if a man bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because he is conscious of God. 20 But how is it to your credit if you receive a beating for doing wrong and endure it? But if you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. 21 To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his steps. 22 "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." 23 When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. 24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. 25 For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls. NIV

- Relationships can be fulfilling but they can also be hard. Sometimes they can be <u>UNFORGIVING</u>.
- Nothing about what Peter is saying speaks of speaks of being <u>INDIVIDUALS</u> separated from other people of like faith.

Two great truths Peter doesn't want us to miss:

- 1. Peter is reminding us of God's amazing <u>GRACE</u> here. How so?
  - God shows grace by putting <u>GENTILES</u> into the family of God.
  - God not only saves us, but gives us a unique place of <u>INTIMACY</u> with God as fellow children through Christ.
  - He also gives to us a great gift of <u>RELATIONSHIP</u>.

Eph 4:6[It is this:] that the Gentiles are now to be <u>fellow heirs</u> [with the Jews], members of the same body and joint partakers [sharing] in the same divine promise in Christ through [their acceptance of] the glad tidings (the Gospel).

- 2. God has <u>DISINHERITED</u> the nation of Israel and <u>DISOWNED</u> it because of their rejection of Christ.
  - Now the religious privilege they enjoyed has been given to whom? The <u>CHURCH.</u>
  - God's promises, purpose, and prophecies to the Hebrew people have not been cancelled--- only <u>POSTPONED</u>.

Our relationship with God today shows itself three ways:

- 1. By our <u>REBIRTH</u>
- 2. By our <u>BELIEF</u>
  - Struggles are to draw us closer to God, not to <u>DISAPPOINT</u> us in God.

- Maintain for yourself and your kids a new <u>ATTITUDE</u> concerning the world around us.
- We need to see a new attitude concerning the WAR within us
- 3. By our <u>BEHAVIOR</u>
  - "Conduct yourself properly" is talking about our <u>CONVERSATIONS</u>, our behavior, and our lifestyle.
  - It means to be <u>HONEST</u> about who you are, and who God is in you.

Principles we have learned in the first two chapters of 1 Peter:

- 1. Relationship sins are serious violations of God's <u>GRACE</u>.
- 2. Peter warns us, you will either come to Christ for salvation or you will <u>REJECT</u> Him.
- 3. Believers are not the <u>CENTERPIECE</u> of the Christian church --Christ is.
- 4. Christians are people God has the right to POSSESS.
- 5. God's gift of grace and salvation must result in a positive <u>CHANGE</u> in a believer's behavior.
- 6. Peter reminds us that we must <u>SUBMIT</u> to human authorities.
- 7. Christian freedom is not a freedom to do as we like, it's a freedom to do what we <u>OUGHT</u>.
- 8. Having a consciousness of the presence of God enables us to <u>ENDURE</u> unjust suffering or treatment.
- Again, remember, it's Jesus alone that enables us to be forgiven and to also <u>FORGIVE</u>. Not forgiving someone is not <u>CONSISTENT</u> with the life of Christ in a believer

Final thoughts and application:

- Spiritual <u>GROWTH</u> should and must be the highest priority for every believer.
- Dealing with our <u>FLESH</u> concerning anger, hatred, envy slander and all hypocrisies must be a believer's constant goal.
- Don't say anything about other <u>BELIEVERS</u> you would not say to their face.
- > <u>UNITY</u> should be a goal and lifestyle in <u>all</u> of our relationships.
- Believers should be <u>UNASHAMED</u> to share what God has done for them through Jesus.
- > Every Christian should be a good <u>ADVERTISEMENT</u> for who God is
- > Moral purity must be the <u>GOAL</u> and the lifestyle of every believer.
- > Don't let your <u>LIBERTY</u> in Christ to be a stumbling block to others.
