1 Peter – Week 17 Trusting God for the Best

1 Peter 3:8 Finally, all [of you] should be of one and the same mind (united in spirit), sympathizing [with one another], loving [each other] as brethren [of one household], compassionate and courteous (tenderhearted and humble). 9 Never return evil for evil or insult for insult (scolding, tongue-lashing, berating), but on the contrary blessing [praying for their welfare, happiness, and protection, and truly pitying and loving them]. For know that to this you have been called, that you may yourselves inherit a blessing [from God--that you may obtain a blessing as heirs, bringing welfare and happiness and protection]. 10 For let him who wants to enjoy life and see good days [good--whether apparent or not] keep his tongue free from evil and his lips from guile (treachery, deceit). 11 Let him turn away from wickedness and shun it, and let him do right. Let him search for peace (harmony; undisturbed-ness from fears, agitating passions, and moral conflicts) and seek it eagerly. [Do not merely desire peaceful relations with God, with your fellowmen, and with yourself, but pursue, go after them!] 12 For the eves of the Lord are upon the righteous (those who are upright and in right standing with God), and His ears are attentive to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who practice evil [to oppose them, to frustrate, and defeat them]. [Ps 34:12-16.] 13 Now who is there to hurt you if you are zealous followers of that which is good? 14 But even in case you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, [you are] blessed (happy, to be envied). Do not dread or be afraid of their threats, nor be disturbed [by their opposition]. 15 But in your hearts set Christ apart as holy [and acknowledge Him] as Lord. Always be ready to give a logical defense to anyone who asks you to account for the hope that is in you, but do it courteously and respectfully.

- When trials come, Peter is going to tell us to <u>PREPARE</u> for the best, instead of waiting for the worst.
- Sometimes we get bad news from a doctor, or something else like that and our <u>NATURE</u> is to prepare for the worst and hope for the best.
- So far Peter has talked about the fiery trials that the new church would experience, and then he moves into one of the greatest trials of life----<u>MARRIAGE</u>.
- Notice this about Peter: he has remained optimistic and <u>POSITIVE</u> in what he is teaching us.

How to Experience the Best in the Worst of Times

- Cultivate and work at Christian LOVE
 - Peter really understood <u>UNCONDITIONAL</u> love because there was a time that was just what he needed and received from Christ.
 - Is it not remarkable that in Peter we see how <u>PATIENT</u> Jesus was with him?
 - Love for God's <u>PEOPLE</u> Loving is not just a command, it's paying a <u>DEBT</u>.
 - Love through <u>UNITY</u> in mind

It is cooperation in the midst of <u>DIVERSITY</u>.

- The evidence of Christian love is <u>COMPASSION</u>. The English word for compassion really means <u>SYMPATHY</u>.
- Love shows itself in biblical <u>PITY</u>. Pity: "a <u>TENDERNESS</u> of heart towards the afflicted"
- Being courteous to others will always require a <u>HUMBLE</u> spirit.
- Love shows itself by how you react and pray for your <u>ENEMIES</u>. Three levels of response to people who hate us:
 - 1. We can return evil for good which is a <u>SATANIC</u> level
 - 2. We can return good for good or evil for evil, and that is a <u>HUMAN</u> level
 - 3. We can return good for evil which is a <u>DIVINE</u> level The world screams for <u>JUSTICE</u> when life is hard, but the Christian responds with <u>MERCY</u>.

Peter's Directives to Us Today

We are called to love God, love our enemies, love one another, and love <u>LIFE</u>.

Loving others and loving life is clearly a <u>CHOICE</u> of man's will. We have three choices:

- 1. We can <u>ENDURE</u> life and make it a burden and play the victim.
- 2. We can <u>ESCAPE</u> life as if we are afraid and on the run from a battle.
- 3. Or we can <u>ENJOY</u> life because we know God is in control.
- We should learn to control our <u>TONGUE</u>.

Wrong words in the hands of a wrong <u>SPIRIT</u> will always bring a wrong result.

✤ We must do good and <u>HATE</u> evil.

♦ We must seek and pursue <u>PEACE</u>.

Final Thoughts

- Christians should <u>ENDEAVOR</u> to be of one mind in the great points of faith, in real affection, and in Christian practice.
- Though Christians cannot be exactly of the same mind, yet they should have <u>COMPASSION</u> and love for one another.
- Christianity requires pity to the distressed, and <u>RESPECT</u> to all that God has made.
