1 Peter Week 4 It's All about Glory

1 Peter 1:3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade-kept in heaven for you, 5 who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. 6 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. 7 These have come so that your faith-of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire-may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. 8 Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, 9 for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

- I. Christians were **<u>BORN</u>** for Glory
 - The glory of God is the sum **<u>TOTAL</u>** of all that God is and does.
 - To understand this, glory is not a separate <u>ATTRIBUTE</u> or characteristic of God, such as holiness or wisdom or mercy.

Psalm 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. 7 The law of the LORD is <u>perfect</u>, reviving the soul.

The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple.

8 The precepts of the LORD are <u>right</u>, giving joy to the heart. `

The commands of the LORD are <u>radiant</u>, giving light to the eyes.

9 The fear of the LORD is <u>pure</u>, enduring forever.

The ordinances of the LORD are <u>sure</u> and altogether righteous. NIV

- Peter gives us two descriptions to help us better understand the truth about glory:
 - 1. the Christian's **BIRTH**
 - Foreknowledge does not suggest that God merely knew ahead of time that we would believe. It also means to set His love upon a person or persons in a <u>PERSONAL</u> way.
 - Whether God chose me or by <u>FAITH</u> I responded to God's calling and truth, it does not change my responsibility to become like Christ, and to share the Gospel whenever I can and to live a holy life.
 - 2. the Christian's HOPE
 - Peter calls it an **INHERITANCE**.
 - Peter tells us this hope, this inheritance, is **INCORRUPTIBLE**.

- Peter tells us it is <u>UNDEFILED</u>.
 It means to be <u>PURE</u>. When we were born again, we <u>EXCHANGED</u> the passing glory of man to the eternal glory of God.
- II. Christians are <u>KEPT</u> for Glory
 - We are, according to Peter, being kept (guarded/ shielded) by the <u>POWER</u> of God.
 - Christ's power will guard us and will **<u>GUIDE</u>** us into eternity.
- III. Christians are being **<u>PREPARED</u>** for glory.

Trials of Life

- 1. Trials meet **NEEDS**
- 2. Trials are **VARIED**
- 3. Trials are not EASY
- Peter is not preaching that we have a careless attitude towards trials trials produce **HEAVINESS**. It means to experience grief and pain. It's a picture of the cross and what Jesus went through for us. Trials can, at times, be really hard.
- 4. Trials are **<u>CONTROLLED</u>** by God.

Final thoughts:

- Learn the <u>LESSONS</u> that trials bring, so that God can and will be glorified in and through us.
- Life on earth ought to be an **ENJOYMENT** of the resurrection of Christ.
