2 Peter - Week 4 Spiritual Growth Brings Results, Part II

2 Peter 1:10 Therefore, my brothers, be all the more eager to make your calling and election sure. For if you do these things, you will never fall, 11 and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. 12 So I will always remind you of these things, even though you know them and are firmly established in the truth you now have. 13 I think it is right to refresh your memory as long as I live in the tent of this body, 14 because I know that I will soon put it aside, as our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. 15 And I will make every effort to see that after my departure you will always be able to remember these things.

We were elected and we did have a choice.

There are two factors in human redemption:

- God's moving of His divine <u>grace</u> towards us God initiated the faith walk and He initiated the cross that man might humbly come to Him, not just for heaven, but for <u>relationship</u>.
- The response of man's <u>heart</u> to this calling Divine grace and effectual calling by God to save us leaves all believers with a tremendous <u>conviction</u> and <u>confidence</u> in the fact God calls and we respond.

What does assurance depend on (apart from the promises of God?) It depends on what you believe.

- Some beliefs are determined by natural disposition.
- Some folks lack <u>faith</u> in what God promises, so fear dictates their beliefs.
- Some folks just believe what they're **told** to believe.

So how can we be certain and know we are growing spiritually?

- 1. We will see fruitfulness.
 - We will be revealing godly <u>character</u> in our everyday life.
 - The believer who is not seeking or growing is called <u>Idle</u> in scripture. The word also means unfruitful or <u>ineffective</u>.

The most effective Christians, the ones God uses in marvelous ways, are not usually superstars.

- They are **available** and growing in Christ.
- They are fruitful because they are **<u>faithful</u>**.

- All we need for life is <u>already</u> inside us.
- People of faith will not stand still. The nature of faith is to grow.
- 2. Christians are fruitful because they have vision.
 - WE are people of revelation.
 - We lose vision mainly because we have <u>forgotten</u> all God has done for us.
 - Peter wants us to open our eyes to see where God is working and join Him.
- 3. Christians are fruitful because have **godly** confidence.
 - The godly, growing Christian walks in confidence because he knows he is <u>secure</u> in Christ.
 - We become fruitful, with Godly vision and a <u>**changed**</u> life because God gives us our assurance.
 - No change, no <u>Jesus</u>.
 - The person who claims to be a child of God and gives no evidence of spiritual growth or <u>desire</u> for the things of God is deceiving himself and will face judgment.

So what should be our response?

- We are to be <u>diligent</u> to make every effort to release in us what God has given us.
- We must allow God to <u>work</u> in us before He can use us according to His will.

Final thoughts:

- True assurance of our salvation and calling requires godly character, and it must be <u>developed.</u>
- Godly assurance comes out of growth and godly <u>living.</u>
