Matt 5:3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 4 Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. 5 Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. 6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. 7 Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. 8 Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. 9 Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. 10 Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

- Victory seems to escape many believers as we struggle in life.
- Victory is when it's said of you what is written about you.
- It's not about filling the church with more people trying to advance the kingdom, it's getting people **filled** with God.
- We tell a new believer of saving faith to get into heaven, but fail to teach a **faith** that takes us through life.
- Instead of thirsting for God and seeking Him <u>desperately</u>, at times we seem to wander from God.
- We just don't have time for <u>self-examination</u>, nor do we really desire it.
 "I'm ok, you're ok." Will I ever get my flesh to line up with the <u>holiness</u> I really desire within?

Revival: "That strange and sovereign work of God in which He visits His own people, <u>restoring</u>, reanimating and releasing them into the fullness of His blessing." Stephen Olford

Three things that must take place in the life of a believer:

- 1. Acknowledge
- 2. Accept
- 3. **<u>Affirm</u>**

So what is the principle for us to learn?

- Every day we are confronted with **choices**. So Matthew chapter 5 is more about **being** than doing.
- Self-examination leads to <u>repentance</u> which leads to right relationship with God and others.

I. The <u>Pathway</u> to Victory

- It's being able to see our **spiritually** hopeless situation, our poverty-driven life, apart from Jesus being Lord.
- The way to victory is the **emptying** of our old self.
- The world says happiness comes from **self-sufficiency** when really it is truly **insufficient.** The world would say "happy are the self-willed" but God says miserable are the self-willed.
- The pathway comes with the acceptance of allowing God to have divine control.

II. The **Passageway** to Victory

- The passageway for us has to be a desire to be <u>free</u> from all sin and the strongholds that hold us hostage.
- Today many believers hunger and thirst for **happiness** or prosperity more than for righteousness.
- Being controlled by the Holy Spirit has got to be the <u>key</u> to the passageway to victory.

III. The **Proofs** of Victory

Proof 1: Those who have received mercy also are willing to give it.

Proof 2: They have a pure heart.

Proof 3: Their **conduct** always seeks peace.

Final thoughts:

- ➤ The verses in Matthew 5 begin with and end with "for theirs is the kingdom of God". We belong to another **kingdom**.
- WE need to open a new book allowing God his rightful place in our lives.
- Remember doing is not as important as <u>being</u>.
