Biblical Faith - Week 3 Dealing with Desperate Situations (Elijah) Part 1

1 Kings 17:1 Now Elijah the Tishbite, from Tishbe in Gilead, said to Ahab, "As the LORD, the God of Israel, lives, whom I serve, there will be neither dew nor rain in the next few years except at my word." 2 Then the word of the LORD came to Elijah: 3 "Leave here, turn eastward and hide in the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan. 4 You will drink from the brook, and I have ordered the ravens to feed you there." 5 So he did what the LORD had told him. He went to the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan, and stayed there. 6 The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and bread and meat in the evening, and he drank from the brook.

- As we begin this journey we will see that God uses the trials of life to show not just His <u>power</u>, but His <u>provision</u> for those who are willing to follow.
- God wants us to be **interdependent** with Him and each other.
- Baal was the god of <u>rain</u> and fertility.
- God is going to deal with <u>national</u> apostasy in Israel.
- God looks for **special** people for difficult situations.

Trials:

- Reveal our <u>helplessness</u>
- 2. Can be distressing
- 3. Come in different forms according to your need
- 4. Are not an **elective** in life, they are a required course.

Life can be hard and should cause us to not only seek God, but to respond to Him in **faith.**

Several truths about faith:

- 1. Faith trusts God's **ability** to take us through the storms.
- 2. Faith looks **above** the circumstances.
- 3. Faith reveals who we are (or whose we are). Trials, then, reveal what you are.
- Sometimes you have to <u>believe</u> (trust in cling to rely on) God even if it takes longer than you want.
- God not only **controls** the rain, but the birds of the air.
- God controls the **natural** order of life.
- One thing I see about Elijah was that while he waited three and a half years, and he did it with <u>contentment</u>.

Four truths we should learn now:

- 1. We have to be willing to allow God to set us aside if He chooses.
- God's direction includes God's <u>provision</u>.
 <u>Entitlement</u> is never satisfied with just enough to live on.
 Sometimes our boll weevils of life have to jolt us out of our <u>comfort zones</u> to see what God has planned and His provision.
- 3. We, like Elijah, have to **trust** God one day at a time.
- 4. A dried up brook is often a sign of God's **pleasure**, not His displeasure.
