Misplaced Faith Part 2 The Ruts that Hold Us Hostage Week 23

John 5:2 Now there is in Jerusalem a pool near the Sheep Gate. This pool in the Hebrew is called Bethesda, having five porches (alcoves, colonnades, doorways). 3 In these lay a great number of sick folk--some blind, some crippled, and some paralyzed (shriveled up)--waiting for the bubbling up of the water. 4 For an angel of the Lord went down at appointed seasons into the pool and moved and stirred up the water; whoever then first, after the stirring up of the water, stepped in was cured of whatever disease with which he was afflicted. 5 There was a certain man there who had suffered with a deep-seated and lingering disorder for thirty-eight years. 6 When Jesus noticed him lying there [helpless], knowing that he had already been a long time in that condition, He said to him, Do you want to become well? [Are you really in earnest about getting well?] 7 The invalid answered, Sir, I have nobody when the water is moving to put me into the pool; but while I am trying to come [into it] myself, somebody else steps down ahead of me. 8 Jesus said to him, Get up! Pick up your bed (sleeping pad) and walk! AMP

- We saw the man at the well had faith but it was <u>misplaced</u>. He trusted water, and he trusted and hoped someone would help.
- Sound familiar? Do you have times of real <u>spiritual</u> ruts in your own personal life?
- They used God to **<u>show</u>** off themselves.
- The kingdom will be taken away from the religious and given to those who <u>understand</u> and seek after God
- Remember, truth is worthless unless **<u>believed</u>** and applied with faith.
- The Pharisees had a problem with belief and the rut of <u>religion</u>. The disciples had a problem with the spiritual rut of <u>compliancy</u>----short on faith and long on doubt.
- The disciples are a picture at times of his church today the Pharisees are a picture of the **unbelieving** world we live in today.

What is a rut?

- "A well traveled path, a <u>grove</u> that when traveled enough in time becomes a rut."
- It's losing sight of what God <u>desires</u> to do in me and it's me trying to accomplish what God desires without His help or direction. It's the independent life.
- One man said it's a <u>grave</u> with both ends kicked out.Its what he called a form of Godliness but no <u>power.</u>
- Godliness is not about tidying up our lives to have God's attention and <u>approval.</u>

Several kinds of ruts:

- 1. Rut of religion
- The rut of <u>repetition</u>
 We become nothing more than <u>spiritual technicians</u>.
- The rut of <u>resentment</u> The root of resentment is <u>pride</u>. Sometimes resentment is caused by <u>un-forgiveness</u>.
- The rut of <u>rebellion</u> The Pharisees rebellion was to <u>truth.</u> <u>Stubbornness</u> is pride in rebellion to God.
- 5. The rut of <u>ridicule</u> Why do we and the Pharisees miss the Redeemer? Redeemers that we love:
 - the <u>rabbit foot</u> redeemer
 - the Aladdin lamp redeemer
 - The "Let's Make a Deal" redeemer (Monty Hall) These shows are based on knowing man is <u>curious</u> and <u>greedy.</u>
- 6. The rut of reality
- 7. The rut of restriction

What do we do to get out of the rut?

- Worship: The returning to and the leaning on God in such a way we can do nothing but worship.
- Walk: Enoch walked with God.
- Work: Don't work just to be pleasing to God, do it out of commitment to who He is.
- Will: Change it, surrender it, give it back to God and make it God's will.
