The Call to Fresh Surrender James 1:2-4 Week 1

James 1:2 Consider it wholly joyful, my brethren, whenever you are enveloped in or encounter trials of any sort or fall into various temptations. 3 Be assured and understand that the trial and proving of your faith bring out endurance and steadfastness and patience.

4 But let endurance and steadfastness and patience have full play and do a thorough work, so that you may be [people] perfectly and fully developed [with no defects], lacking in nothing. AMP

Gal 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. NIV

Adversity comes in the life of a believer for one of three reasons:

1. Correction

I believe God is always trying to teach us so we can learn, really learn, how to overcome our own **flaws** and flesh.

- 2. Sometimes adversity comes for enlargement.
 - The goal: Christ-likeness
 - We must have a life that brings God joy.

3. **Testimony**

- He is never done <u>refining</u> and teaching us.
- We are partakers in His blessings, His love, His wisdom, and His power.

So what is the key?

I believe it's an unceasing, absolute <u>dependence</u> on God, that allows Him to not just live in us, but to manifest His presence to others through us.

OK, how?

- We must exchange our lives for God's <u>humility</u>.
- Dependence on God cannot happen without humility and presenting ourselves as totally <u>empty vessels</u> that God can dwell in and manifest His life and power in us.
- Think on this: Redemption is God's way of <u>restoring</u> lost humility to a world that knows very little about it.
- Humility, according to Murray, gave death its <u>value</u>.
- Humility is the **root** of our relationship with God.
- So then, the loss of humility is the root of all evil and sin, and releases man's **pride**.

- We fail because we keep trying to put our flesh to death instead of replacing it with the life of Christ.
- When the flesh wants to "jump me" and take over, I must, in <u>prayer</u>, turn to Christ.
- Fresh surrender are just words until I learn, by faith, to <u>implement</u> surrender in my daily life.
- We must learn to settle for nothing less than death to ourselves, relying totally on Christ, before humility can reach its **potential**.
- Tom Elliff shared this: <u>"Fresh</u>-not previously done; something completely new". <u>"Surrender:</u> Faithful; a fresh giving up of oneself; voluntarily cooperating with God."

Final Thoughts:

I can't trust my own strength to accomplish this, but must learn the life of Christ. OK, how?

- 1. Recognize our own <u>pride</u> when it comes to handling the tough people and circumstances of life.
- 2. Learn what <u>motivates</u> our surrender. Joseph was humble and served <u>faithfully</u>.
- 3. Learn how to measure our **success** from God's eyes.
- 4. When we place all we are in God's hands, He will truly be **glorified** and others will see that we have been with Jesus.
- 5. Without a servant's heart and <u>attitude</u>, we have nothing in common with Christ.
