Fresh Surrender - Week 2 Humility and Happiness

2 Cor. 12:7 To keep me from becoming conceited (exalted above measure. KJV) because of these surpassingly great revelations, there was given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. 8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. 9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. NIV

- We have already seen that the **key** is knowing the humility of Christ and implementing that humility in our own lives.
- Instead of getting all bent out of shape, stop and ask God for the message.
- Humility is an awareness that God's way is best.
- God's answer was that the trial came to be a <u>blessing</u> to Paul.
- Our weakness and humiliation, due to sin or our faithlessness, brings about grace and the Lord's <u>strength</u> to overcome.
- Instead of just <u>enduring</u> trials, gritting our teeth and accepting what we so dislike, Paul teaches us to "glory in it."

Every Christian virtually passes through two **stages** in pursuit of humility:

- 1. We <u>fear</u> and flee and run away from all God desires to do to bring humility in our lives. Instead of seeking humility at any <u>cost</u>, we run and hide or transfer blame to others.
- 2. We need a new revelation of the Lord Jesus, giving us an opportunity.

Ok, what does that really mean to us?

- The <u>presence</u> of God can reveal our own selfishness and sin and nothing but the Spirit of God can expel <u>self.</u>
- Paul's thorn in the flesh, the testing of his faith, led to the **experience** of the presence and power of God.
- The grace for humility is **greater** and nearer than what we think.

How is God exalted in all this? How will God conquer our own pride?

- 1. Doing what God says is our responsibility.
 - ? Is it our job to cast out our own pride? Or is that God's work as I follow, until there is no pride left.
 - ? Is <u>holiness</u> our work or is that the work God is going to accomplish as I learn to follow and obey?
 - ? So what does humility require? We must take every **opportunity** to respond with humility before God and man-- especially when life is hard.
 - Our faith is in the <u>grace</u> of God. It gives us assurance that all the grace we need is already here, and more is coming to handle the trials of life.
- 2. In all we do, we must <u>trust</u> that God will do His part. We set our hearts on the <u>source</u> of all blessings.

The Law of Human Nature

- Actions produce habits, habits breed disposition, disposition forms the will, and a rightly formed will is called **character**.
- Andrew Murray says: "The lower, the emptier a man lies before God, the speedier and the fuller will be the inflow of the divine glory."
- We must learn to come to Christ and <u>pray.</u>

Four things about this carnal state God must overcome:

- 1. The carnal state is a condition of lingering infancy.
- 2. The carnal state has an absence of **love** and God's Spirit.
- 3. The carnal state is a person who is a **repeat** offender.
- 4. The carnal state causes man to become <u>unfit</u> to receive spiritual truth.

Final thoughts:

- We must recognize there is a **spiritual** life to be lived here on earth.
- ➤ Going from the self-life to the God-directed life is just one step away.
- ➤ Humble surrender leads to grace and God's mercy.
